# WHAT IS THE BALKAN PHYSICAL UNION?

Balkan Physical Union (BPU) is the Union of the Societies of Physicists from Balkan countries.

BPU is a non-governmental scientific organization that fosters collaboration in physics across the Balkan region.

The idea to found the Balkan Physical Union was first devised and put in motion by Prof A. Milojevic (Yugoslavia) and Prof. I Ursu (Romania) at the VIII Congress), held in Pristina (Yugoslavia) in November 1985 where the proposal was accepted.

The first Balkan Physical Union Council meeting was held in Bucharest in 1987.

The first BPU President (1985-1989) was Ioan Ursu from Romania



The first BPU President elected during the first BPU Council meeting was Prof Ioan Ursu, former European Physical Society President. The Secretary, was Dr. Andrei Dorobantu from Romania, was also elected and the Secretariat was set up in Bucharest.



#### Memorandum of Agreement **Reciprocal Rights**

The Balkan Physical Union (BPU) The European Physical Society (EPS)

This memorandum outlines an agreement between the Balkan Physical Union (BPU) and the European Physical Society (EPS) on the issue of reciprocal rights.

#### Membership

Members of the Balkan Physical Union may become members of the European Physical Society at the rates for Collaborating Society members defined in the EPS Constitution and by-laws.

If applicable, Members of the European Physical Society may become members of the Balkan Physical Union at the rates defined by the Balkan Physical Union.

#### Conferences

Members of the European Physical Society may register at Balkan Physical Union meetings at discounted rates where applicable.

Members of the Balkan Physical Union may register at European Physical Society meetings at discounted rates where applicable.

#### Publications 3.

Members of the European Physical Society may submit manuscripts to the Balkan Physical Union Publications under the same conditions as members of the Balkan Physical Union

Members of the Balkan Physical Union may submit manuscripts to the European Physical Society Publications under the same conditions as members of the European Physical Society.

#### Information

The European Physical Society and the Balkan Physical Union will inform their members on the existence of this agreement. In particular, members of each society will be invited to sign up for newsletters and other information channels made available by the societies.

#### Cooperation

The Executive Committee of the European Physical Society and the Executive Committee of the Balkan Physical Union will exchange regularly on issues of common interest, and explore potential joint activities in fields such as outreach, communication, education etc.

#### 6. Term and Termination

This agreement shall commence once this document is signed by the Presidents of the two societies and will remain in force until either the Balkan Physical Union or the European Physical Society gives 12 months' notice of termination or a wish to renegotiate the agreement.
